

FAITH DEVELOPMENT MINISTRY

EPIPHANY – As we turn the page of our calendar from 2024, we delight acknowledging that God has allowed us yet another year of life. A year in which we celebrate afresh God's presence in our lives. We acknowledge that this year, 2025, affords us new experiences as the people of God. Yet, we do not enter this year unscathed. We bring with us pain and sorrow from losses endured in 2024. As we turn the page, let us reflect on lyrics written by Andre' Crouch, in his song, "Through It All." Therein, he penned the words, "I have had many tears and sorrows. I have had questions for tomorrow. There have been times that I didn't know right from wrong. But in every situation, God gave blessed consolation that my trials have only come to make me strong ... Through it all, through it all, I have learned to trust in Jesus, I have learned to trust in God."

As we turn the page, we look forward with heightened anticipation to the wonders God will reveal in our lives, and for our common good. Turning the page, we enter the season many churches celebrate as Epiphany. Webster defines Epiphany as "1. A Christian festival held on January 6th to celebrate the manifestation of the divine nature of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi. 2. A revelatory manifestation of a divine being. 3.a. A sudden manifestation of the meaning

or essence of something. b. A sudden intuitive realization or perception of reality."

Examples of Epiphany appear in many familiar biblical passages: In the Old Testament, aka Hebrew Scripture, God spoke to Moses after claiming Moses' attention through a burning bush; God provided a pillar of clouds by day and a pillar of fire by night for the Hebrew people as they traveled in the wilderness; and God called the child Samuel from slumber and his mentor, Eli, taught Samuel how to respond. Turning to our New Testament Scripture, we find examples of Epiphany in John upon seeing Jesus informing his followers, "Behold the Lamb of God"; the woman at the well in Samaria, whom Jesus engaged in conversation and taught about living water to quench her thirst; and Saul being knocked down from his horse and challenged as to why he was persecuting the Christ.

Yes, this is the season of Epiphany. Let celebrate US and rejoice as we, too, find



evidence of God in our midst. Epiphany extends through the months of January and February.

ensures that low-income families will have access to the internet. Funding for this

program will end unless action is taken.

AGUCC'S 1ST EVER CHILI COOKOFF!!


Do you make chili? Is it good? Do you brag about it even a little bit? Well, here's your chance to "put your money where your mouth is" on Sunday, March 16th.
